



DISPLAY SPACE FOR THE 2022 SUNSHINE COAST ART CRAWL

The District of Sechelt's community public art program showcases the work of local artists and highlights the creativity of our community. The District of Sechelt is inviting artists to apply for the opportunity to display their work in the Rockwood Lodge during the 2022 Sunshine Coast Art Crawl (October 21-23, 2022). This venue is wheelchair accessible and contains a kitchen and an accessible bathroom.

ELIGIBILITY

Artists must:

1. Reside on the lower Sunshine Coast
2. Be in need of a publicly-accessible studio space for the Art Crawl (i.e. your artwork is not already on display at another location during the Art Crawl).
3. Apply to the Sunshine Coast Art Crawl as a solo-artist or as a group of artists and follow the participation guidelines as described by the Coast Cultural Alliance at www.sunshinecoastartcrawl.com
4. Have at least 1 artist in attendance at the venue for the duration of the Art Crawl (10am – 5pm Friday, Saturday & Sunday)
5. Pay a \$300 refundable damage deposit and obtain \$2 million liability coverage for the duration of the Art Crawl

1. Cover letter including name and contact information
2. Artist CV or résumé
3. A written statement (250-350 words) describing your artistic practice and your interest in this opportunity. Please indicate whether you want the main floor rooms or lower level.
4. Samples of artwork (5 to 10 images) that would be on display during the Art Crawl. Please include a list of artworks to accompany the images.

*if submitting an application as a group of artists, please include the above items for each participant

Rockwood Arts Space: This lower level space can accommodate 1-2 artists working in 2D (painting, drawing, printmaking etc.). The Arts Space is a 750 sq. ft. room located on the lower level of the Rockwood Lodge heritage building. All walls have art rails for hanging 2D artwork. Tables and chairs are available upon request.



Rockwood Main floor: The main floor space can accommodate 1-2 artists. The main floor of the Rockwood Lodge still captures the original look and feel of the 1920s lodge with tables that can be used for displaying 3D artwork or crafts. There are no art rails for hanging artwork in this space.



Please be advised that the District of Sechelt is not obliged to accept any of the submissions and may reject all submissions. All information provided under this submission shall be considered confidential and shall only be disseminated to District of Sechelt staff and partners for the purposes of the selection process. Artists will retain copyright.
