Artists selected for this roster will be eligible to be considered for community art projects such as utility box art wraps and lamppost banner designs located in Sechelt within the two-year term.

Open to artists residing on the Sunshine Coast, we invite and encourage diverse applicants from all backgrounds to showcase their creativity. Artwork should be designed as suitable for public spaces, reflecting our dedication to inclusivity and respect for everyone. Students of fine art, design, and architecture schools are welcome to apply.

About:

The Artist Roster is a curated resource list of pre-approved artists ready to be involved with a variety of public art projects. This streamlined process ensures that artists can be easily contracted, bringing dynamic artworks to our streets and fostering a deeper sense of civic pride and identity. Whether temporary or permanent, these public artworks are crafted to fit the unique parameters of each project, enhancing our community's visual landscape.

Eligibility:

Visual artists, graphic designers, photographers and students of fine art, design and architecture residing on the Sunshine Coast. District of Sechelt employees are not eligible to apply.

Project Scope:

Project scope and requirements will be determined on a case-by-case basis and may be design-only or inclusive of project management and/or installation. Projects may be of a “pop-up” nature, semi-permanent, or permanent, and will be reflective of site-specific criteria, the nature of the space and design guidelines from the District of Sechelt.

Evaluation:

A selection committee will review all applications and select artists for the roster. The artists selected will be contacted on a case-by-case basis as art opportunities arise. Artist fees will vary for each project.

Intake and Project Timeline

Application Deadline: **Friday, February 28, 2025 by 4:30 pm PST**. Late submissions will not be considered.

Projects May Commence: April 1, 2025 to March 31, 2027.
