Mental Health Related Occurrences:

An increase in Q4 2025/ YTD statistics for mental health related occurrence compared to Q4 2024 / YTD was anticipated and is reflective of a process change that was implemented at the start of 2025 Q2. This process change reflects a more accurate use of the “mental health study field” on Sunshine Coast RCMP files. Statistics now capture repeat calls for service for a small number of chronic clients suffering from mental health issues. These calls often relate to “check well being” and “suspicious person/occurrence” calls for service, which do not necessarily represent a specific mental health crisis call.

Property Crime Increases:

Increases in Property Crime have been well reported within the community and media sources. Numerous arrests have been made with a number of repeat offenders currently incarcerated. Increased Foot Patrols have been deployed since early December and have contributed to a reduction in recent incidents of reported crime as well as an improved perception of public safety. This increase in police visibility has been made possible through the Provincially funded C-STEP program. Positive public and business feedback to this initiative has demonstrated a benefit to maintaining this program. The SC RCMP will be looking at funding options with the District of Sechelt and the Provincially funded C-STEP program to allow for year round foot patrols in the Downtown Sechelt area.
