
Free Tree!

Thanks to a grant from **BC Hydro - Tree Canada**, the **District of Sechelt** will be able to plant more street trees in our community through a new Adopt-a-Street Tree program.

The Adopt-a-Street Tree program invites residents to apply to have a free street tree planted on the road allowance in front of their property. Sechelt Parks Department will plant the tree and, as 'adoptees', homeowners will commit to watering their tree a minimum of two years and during extended dry periods thereafter.

It is through innovative programs like this that the District is working to enhance our urban forest and to meet the goals set in our Urban Forest Plan.

Tree Location Requirement Overview



If you live on a standard lot (see diagram), you can have one tree planted on the road allowance of your property. If you live on a corner lot (see diagram), you can have up to three trees planted.

Road allowances vary throughout Sechelt. Sechelt Parks staff will come out to see if there is enough space to plant a tree on the road allowance of your property.

Help keep Sechelt Green

Trees help keep Sechelt Clean and Green by:

- Absorbing odours and pollution from the air
- Providing shade and bird habitat
- Reducing noise pollution
- Beautifying neighbourhoods



Watering Tips

To get a good start a healthy tree needs at least 3 to 5 gallons of water twice a week for the first two years. Additional watering during hot, dry periods and in subsequent years may be necessary.
